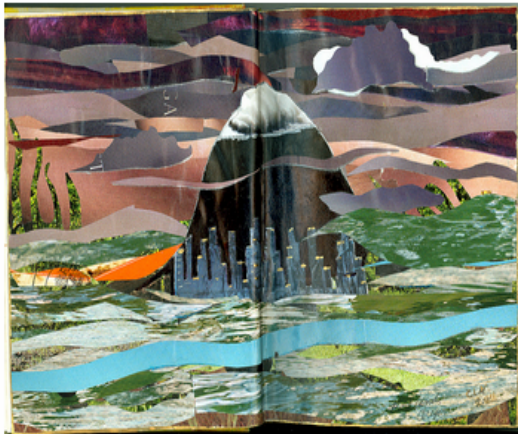

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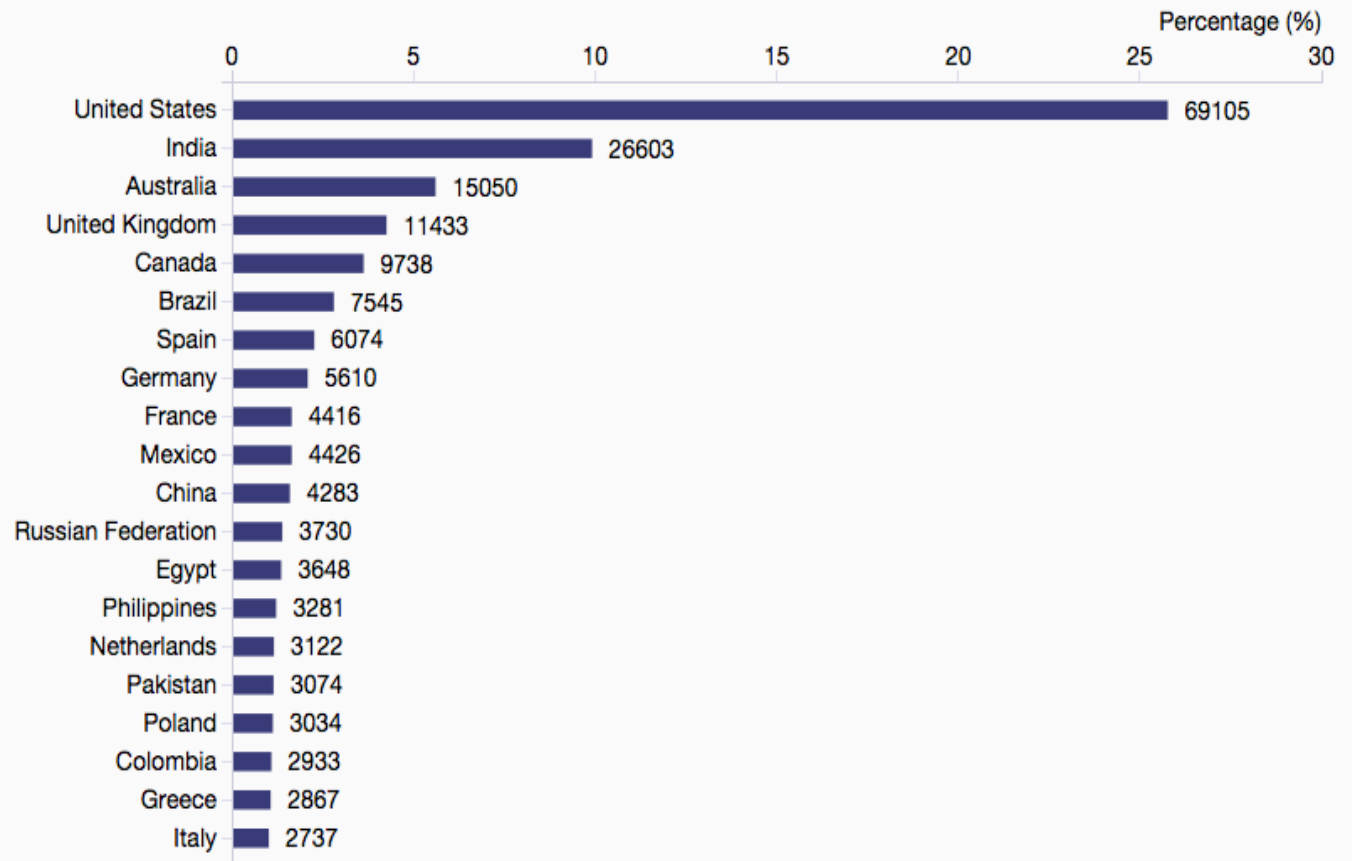

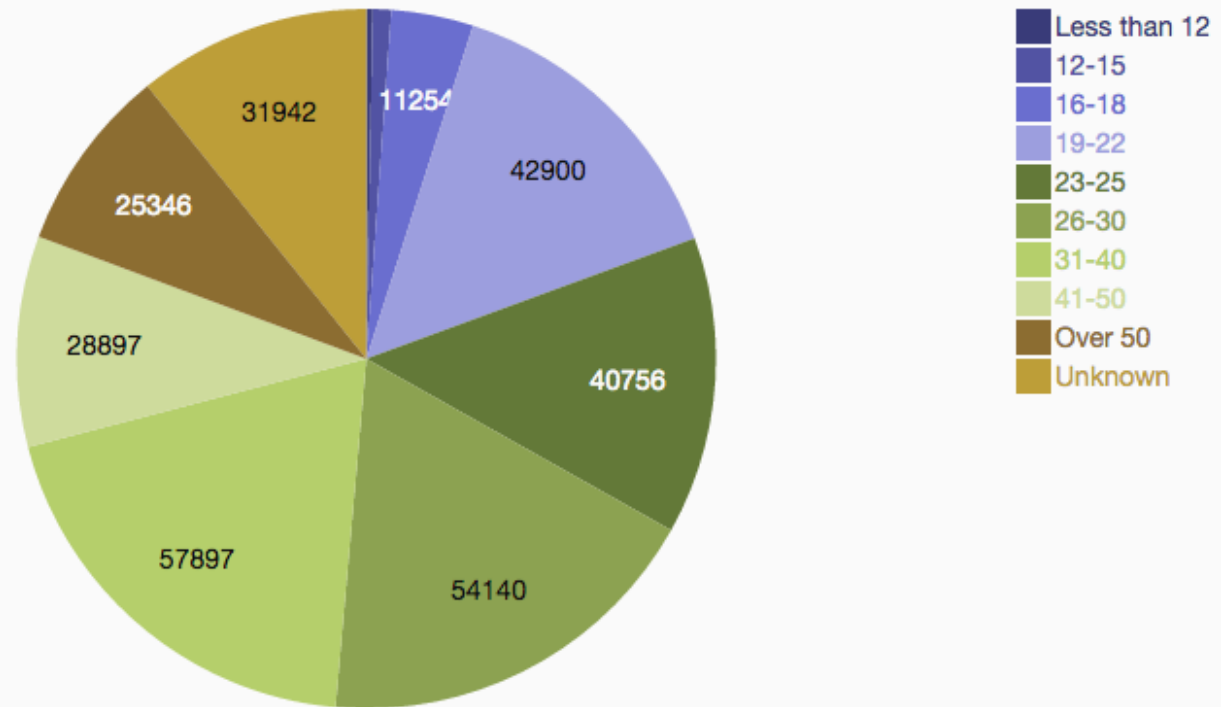
UQx Enrolment Demographics - Countries

Top Countries (total 219 countries)

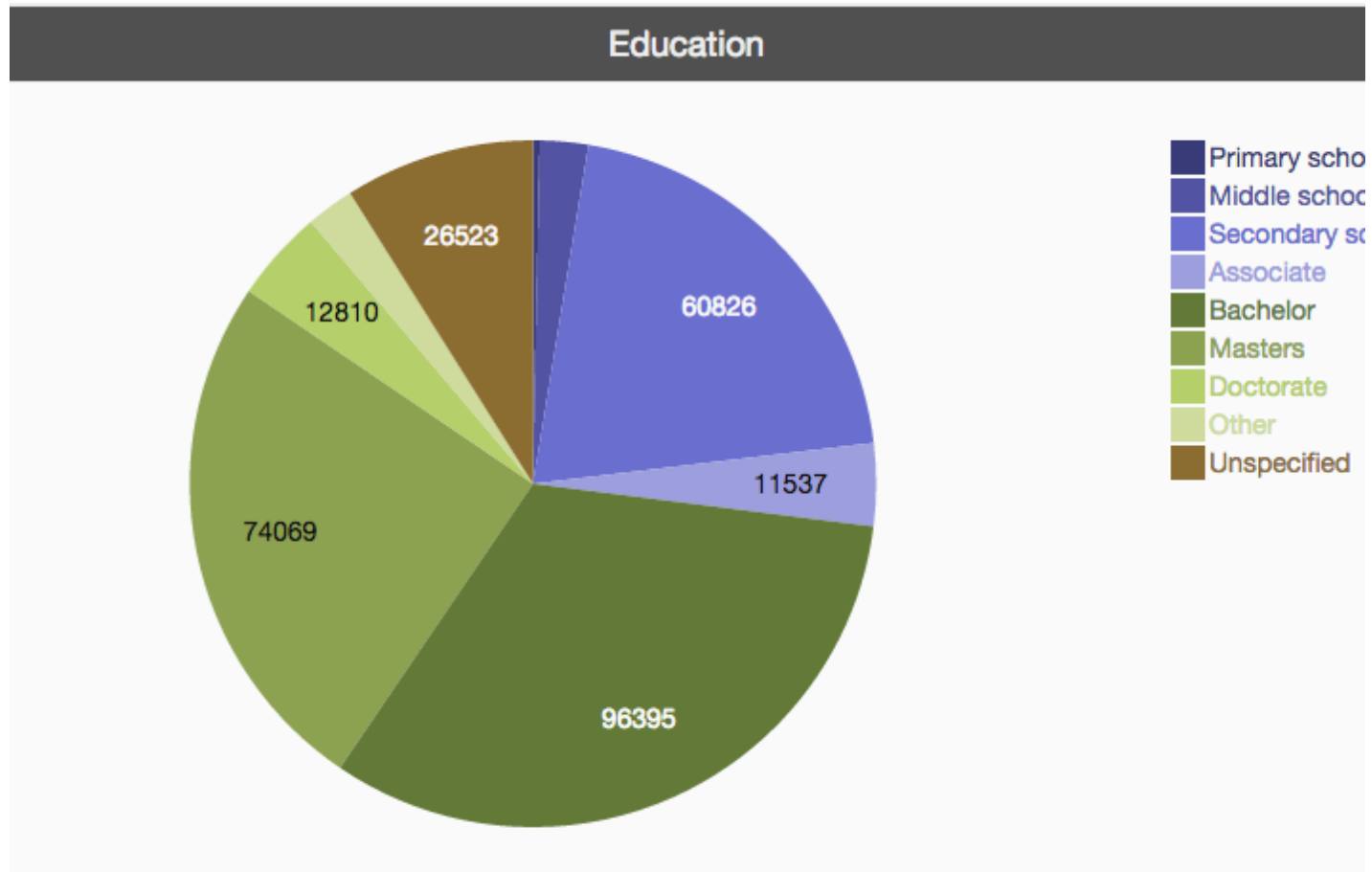


UQx Enrolment Demographics - Age Groups
